



# Attention High School Seniors and Current College Students It is Scholarship Application Time!

If you are interested in applying for a scholarship, please e-mail your request for the application to cec@fumcor.com (this is the email for the Christian Education Scholarship Committee). Please indicate if this is your first time applying or if you are a returning student, as there are different applications for each one.

Considerations for first time applicants are (1) you must be an active participant at FUMCOR, (participating where possible in worship, praying for the fellowship, sharing in the Bible study disciplines, or pledging to a church ministry.) (2) community involvement, (3) financial need and (4) educational objectives, (5) you will be enrolled in an accredited vocational school, 2-year accredited college, or 4-year accredited college or university. If you are a returning candidate, we will consider (1) your participation in the areas of leadership, Bible study, Christian fellowship at your local college or university, (2) financial need, (3) educational objectives, (4) you are enrolled in an accredited vocational school, 2-year accredited college, or 4-year accredited college or university.

The application process will be handled via email, so it is important that you use an email address that will be valid through the end of August. Submission deadline is May 5, 2017. Candidates will be notified of the scholarship awarded at the end of May.

A Memoir of Overcoming by Hattie Kauffman


