was defeated by Belgium, I enjoyed the 2018 FIFA World Cup Games very much!

It was delightful to witness a miracle for Croatia, a tiny country in Europe, to advance to the final. France, as the winner, played really well throughout all their games, and they deserved the World Cup! Congratulations to France and to all the teams around the world!

During the World Cup, have you ever noticed and wondered about Team

France's national symbol ("Rooster") on the players' jerseys (see the picture on the left on Page 1)? It is called the "Gallic Rooster," and reveals a fascinating history. Of course "FFF" stands for "French Football Federation."

According to some, there are three origins: (1) In Latin, "Gallus" (rooster) and "Gallus" (Gaul – "France") were homonyms; (2) Jesus predicted that Peter would deny him three times before the rooster crowed on the following morning, so the rooster became a Christian symbol of watchfulness and readiness; (3) The rooster's crowing at the dawning of each new morning made it a symbol of the daily victory of light over darkness and the triumph of good over evil.

Interestingly, there is another popular "rooster" symbol (see the picture on the right on Page 1) within the Christian community. "Walk to Emmaus" (United Methodist), along with its partner spiritual movements, such as "Crusillo" (Roman Catholic), and "Tres Dias" (International and interdenominational), has an emblem of a multi-colored rooster that shows the rainbow.

The beautiful rainbow is an ultimate and significant symbol of God's inclusive love for everyone! I highly recommend you to experience God's amazing love through this wonderful spiritual retreat "Walk to Emmaus."

This year's Vacation Bible School (VBS) will be held for three days during the weekend (August 3-5) with the theme of "Polar Blast Where Jesus' Love Is Cool." Its Bible Point is "Jesus Will Always Love You," and the Key Verse is Psalm 13:5, "**I trust in your un-failing love.**" Yes, we trust in God's un-failing love always. Please have your children enjoy this special weekend of God's love! I am grateful to God for this year's VBS Director Alice Musarra and all the teachers, assistants, helpers, and parents. It will be an awesome summer event for our children to experience God's love together!

I still remember the theme song of "Tres Dias" that I attended about 25 years ago: "De Colores." It's a Spanish song that was inspired by God's steadfast love for everyone through the multi-colored rooster and the rainbow. One phrase of the song "De Colores"

FUMCOR is a Hub of Activity Every Day

Have you ever thought about how FUMCOR is supported and connected to so many partners in the community? The church is a hub of activity, from the trolleys running jurors back and forth to the courthouse, to the groups like PEO, AA and Thrive renting our rooms during the week.

A Meals on Wheels operation has quietly served homebound and elderly residents from our church since 1972, when it was founded by FUMCOR church members. It remains a strong non-profit today serving all of Riverside. A Scout House has been home to Boy Scout troops for decades. The Path of Life Ministry uses our church on a Sunday morning to hold services for people who have been homeless and provide a focal point for ongoing homeless ministries. Our own members use our kitchen facilities for scheduled homeless sack lunches, and hot meal preparation for the shelters.

Some generous restaurants in the community let us "Dine for Dollars" on certain days with some of that money coming back for the missions work of the church, including Marie Callender's, California Pizza Kitchen, and The Habit. Now we have added Amazon Smile as a way to support the church.

Some of our other global Missions work is funded through our connectional ties with many other Methodist Churches making missionary work and disaster relief just "part of who we are."

But to keep all these ministries and services alive, we must maintain a strong viability as a church. Make sure you, as a member of the family, are supporting the church with regular gifts and offerings. That is the largest and most important partnership keeping your church humming along. There is no substitute for YOU.
