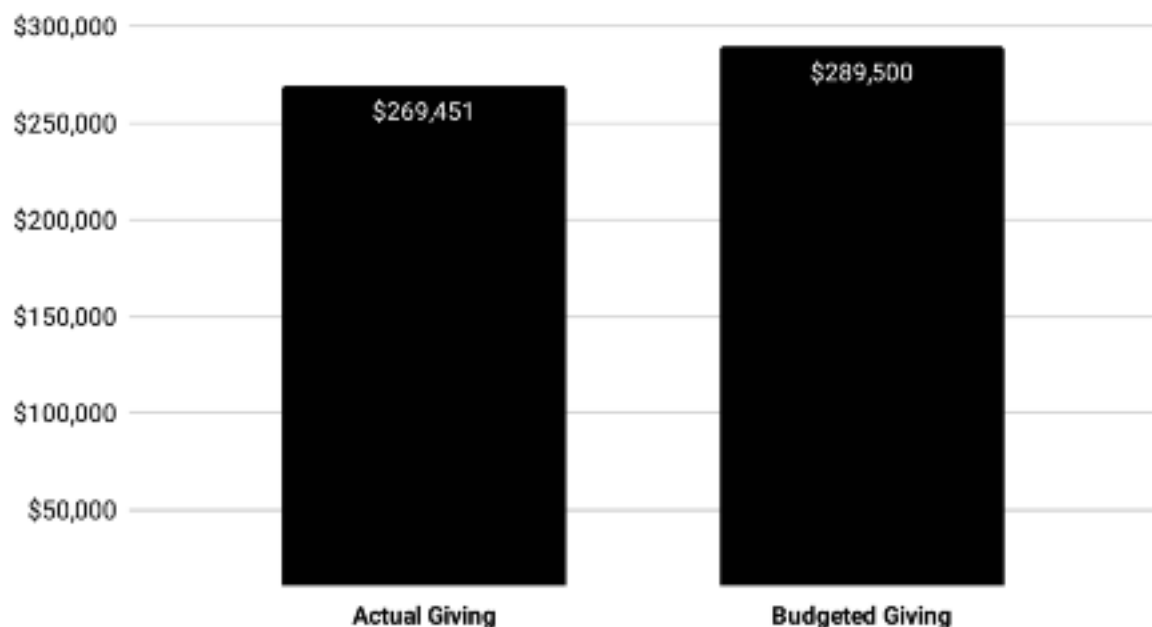

## **Read with Grandma**

Our church is blessed to share the campus with an award-winning preschool. We see the children during drop off and pick up in the church parking lot. We know several of the teachers, but we often do not know the families who bring their children to us.

If you love children and would like to be part of preschool story time and read to the children, this invitation is for you. United Methodist Women and First United Methodist Preschool are going to start a program called "Read with Grandma." Four or more "grandmas" will visit the preschool and read to the children in their classrooms. We will be scheduled to read once a month.

Reading will start at 11:00 and finish about 11:45. The program will start in January and end in May. 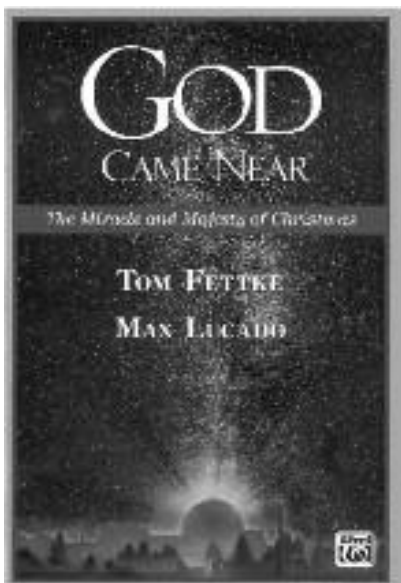
