The Alternative Gift Fair will continue online in 2020 with vendors sharing their wares via Facebook and taking payment via checks or online apps.

What it lacks in soup and bread, it will gain in convenience for shoppers no matter where they live. Proceeds are going to good causes. Plus, one generous church member who wants to remain anonymous

skipped all the online work and just sent a \$5,000 check to Heifer International through our church office!

Heifer Project is just one of many organizations that will benefit from the Alternative Gift Fair this year. A high school sophomore is making hand made paper flowers with all proceeds going to Path of Life Family Shelter. Paper artist Margaret Goodward supports a girl's school, the Riverside Food Cooperative supports locally sourced groceries, Inlandia Institute supports locally sourced literature. Another vendor, Pencils and Dreams, supports schools in Africa. We round out our fair with Ten Thousand Villages, Heifer International and the Assistance League Thrift Shop. There may even be a church parking lot event to hand off some of the purchases to local residents, but all the buying and selling will happen online.
