²²Then Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said, "Athenians, I see how extremely religious you are in every way. ²³For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, 'To an unknown god.' What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. ²⁴The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, ²⁵ nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals life and breath and all things. ²⁶ From one ancestor he made all nations to inhabit the whole earth, and he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where they would live, ²⁷ so that they would search for God and perhaps grope for him and find him—though indeed he is not far from each one of us. ²⁸ For 'In him we live and move and have our being'; as even some of your own poets have said, 'For we too are his offspring.'

²⁹ "Since we are God's offspring, we ought not to think that the deity is like gold, or silver, or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of mortals. ³⁰ While God has overlooked the times of human ignorance, now he commands all people everywhere to repent, ³¹ because he has fixed a day on which he will have the world judged in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed, and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead."

(Pastor) Source of unity and strength, in our longing for wholeness, we reach out to your Son, whose touch heals our brokenness; in our yearning for community, we take hold of the promise of Christ, whose life and love bind us together as one.

(Kris Lovekin, Lay Leader) From lives of separation and distrust, knit us into one family, where all are welcome and honored. As we share the bread of life and drink the cup of salvation, forge us anew as one people of faith.

(All) Amen.

COMMUNION LITANY (Adapted from Psalm 105)

(Pastor) Once we were not a people.

(Congregation) Now we are God's people.

- (P) Once we had no place to call our home.
- (C) Now we abide in God's everlasting arms.
- (P) Once we had no family.
- (C) Now all who confess Jesus with their lips, and do the works of Christian love, are our sisters and brothers.
- (P) Once we ate, but our hunger was not satisfied.
- (C) Now we feast on the living bread, the bread of heaven.
- (P) Once we drank, but our thirst was not quenched.
- (C) Now we drink our fill from God's cup, the cup of blessing.

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

(Pastor) The Lord be with you.

(Congregation) And also with you.

- (P) Lift up your hearts.
- (C) We lift them up to the Lord.
- (P) Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God.
- (C) It is right to give our thanks and praise.

(Lay Leader) It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere, to give thanks to you, Almighty God, creator of all things in heaven and on earth. In the beginning, you brought forth life, that every living thing might live in harmony in the great circle of life. After fashioning our frame from the dust and bones of the earth, you placed your image within us, and declared that it was not good for us to be alone.

(Pastor) Created to be in unity and harmony with creation and with one another, you sent us prophets and teachers when we broke fellowship with one another and when our pride sought out differences among us. In the fullness of time, you sent your Son, Jesus Christ, to fashion us into a holy community that would be his body here on earth.

(Lay Leader) Even when dissent and division threatened to pull his followers apart, Jesus prayed that we might all be one in his name and shared with us the bread of heaven and the cup of our salvation in his name. And so, with your people on earth, and all the company of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn, saying:

(All Sing)

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

(Lay Leader) Holy are you, and blessed is your bread of heaven, Christ Jesus. When you sent Christ to be with us, he offered his very self, that we might have the strength to stand when all hope seems lost. Through the holy mystery of this table, you invite us into your presence, tend us in our weakness, and strengthen us through this bread and cup.

(Pastor) With joy and gratitude, we remember that night when Jesus took the bread, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: "Take, eat, this is the bread of life, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

After supper, Jesus took the cup, blessed it and gave it to his disciples, saying: "Drink from this, all of you. This is my life in the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as your drink it, in remembrance of me."

(Lay Leader) And so, in remembrance of these, your mighty acts of love and grace, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving. As your covenant people and as reflections of your glory, in union with Christ's love for us, we proclaim the mystery of faith.

(All Sing)

Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

PRAYER OF CONSECRATION (Adapted from John 17:20-26)

(Lay Leader) Gracious God, pour out your Spirit and your Power upon these gifts of bread and wine, that through this holy sacrament, we might be the body of Christ for the world. Make them be for us your loving presence, living in us and through us. As your Spirit calls us into unity, through the power of Christ Jesus, make us one with you, one with each other, and one in ministry to the world.

(All Sing)

Amen, amen, amen.

(Lay Leader) And now, with the confidence of children of God, let us pray:

(All) Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.
