This year's honorees are Cindy Qualtieri, Shirley Parks, Pam Conlin, and in memory of Bessie Ridley.




Handcrafters

Shiver to the Sounds of Halloween

At 7 o'clock on Saturday, Oct. 26, as the waning crescent moon floats eerily in the night sky like the Grim Reaper's glimmering scythe, don your favorite shroud and venture into the gathering gloom for a truly terrifying organ concert—"Creepy Pipes and Creaky Keys"—right here in our shadowy sanctuary.

In addition to perennial favorites like Johann Sebastian Bach's "Toccata and Fugue in D Minor" and a revamped assortment of "Ghoultide Carols," you'll hear sepulchral selections requested by members of our congregation, including a "thrilling" number by Michael Jackson, a "chilling" gothic toccata, and a "distilling" of television and movie themes. You'll take a luxury cruise to the "Isle of the Dead," waltz with vampires, and accompany Modest Mussorgsky to a rather startling art exhibition. Your itinerary also features a musical nature hike that you'll never forget, provided that you survive!

If you are so inclined, come in costume! The concert is free, but a freewill offering will be accepted for the Organ Dedicated Fund.

Your generous donations continue to produce valuable results. In September, organ technician Sean O'Neal completed the labor-intensive process of replacing the brittle, decaying leather pouches on one of the two wind chests for the Great manual (the middle keyboard, sporting loud stops for congregational hymns and bombastic postludes). In the photo at top right, you can see the freshly releathered pouch rails. Sean will thoroughly tune the organ before the concert, and in November, he will releather the second Great wind chest. Then he'll tackle further projects—releathering the pedal chests, replacing the disintegrating screen between the pipes and the chancel, recovering an increasingly leaky air reservoir, repairing damaged pipes, and so on.

Thank you for your ongoing support, and I'll see you at the concert!
