### A Baptism by Fire for SoCal

California wildfires destroyed two United Methodist churches and upended the lives of leaders and congregation members in Pacific Palisades and Altadena. Our Cal-Pac Bishop explains more about how the church is helping with meals, supplies, prayer and shelter.

**Jan. 11** — "I just got home after being out and about with churches and people who are surviving, helping, and showing Christ's love in action. I made a cup of coffee and put up my feet and noticed how dirty they were. "Gross!" I thought. These feet need a washing, maybe

even a baptism. Two things came to me. First, the scripture "Beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news." My feet don't look too beautiful today. Those of you who know me well, know I'm most comfortable in Birkenstocks. I'm one of those who will put on socks with my Birks if it's cold. (I know, not the best look). Today my feet walked through streets, church halls, and church parking lots filled with ash. The ash isn't so visible now, but my feet knew it's still there.

Californians have been walking in ash for days. It's our reality. Los Angelenos have been out and about delivering goods, and the good news of togetherness, en masse. They have reminded each other, "You are not alone."

Jan. 13 -- "Collar Day. Sometimes it's the little things. Like wearing your collar when your community is in crisis so that your identity as clergy is known. If you have energy to meet people as you are out and about today, the simple act of letting yourself be recognized as a faith leader is calming. Someone may need an encouraging word, and maybe even a prayer. Clergy: collar up!"

### Bishop's Fire Response (cont.)

Jan. 25 — "This past week I drove into Altadena to see the church, Altadena UMC. As I walked around the front edges of the property, I saw the devastation that comes when a town is burned down. My heart paused at grief for a bit as I stood there. So much ministry and so many gospel messages have been proclaimed from this place. I did my best to hold back the tears.

A guard came by and asked if we were ok. I let him know this was my church. I told him I was the bishop, not the pastor, but that didn't seem to matter, just holding on to the words: "This is my church."

And he said, I'm sorry for your loss." He stood near and listened, and comforted, and kept us safe. He gave us as much time as we needed.

As we were getting ready to leave I noticed a sign that was hung on the wall to the side parking lot entrance. It said: Chartered 1886. "By faith, we've come this far.

With hope we are trusting in God's promise for the future."

The sign survived the fire. It is a message of hope for the future of this church to the people who lost their town. We trust. We know of God's promises. And we know Who holds the future.






### How Are We Doing Financially?

As the new Chair of the Finance Committee, I would like to update the church's faithful on the financial status of the church as of the end of 2024. First, in 2024 our total giving through pledges, special offerings, gifts, and other donations was the highest in the past five years at \$419,356.26. Our members rose to the challenge of addressing our increasing expenses with incredible generosity. Still our expenses exceeded our income by \$12,153.42. We were able to cover this deficit by using income and dividends from our Merrill Lynch Trust Account. We did not have to use any of the principle in the Trust Account.

Casualty Insurance increased over our budgeted amount, and we lost income from facility rentals and other sources. Thank goodness for the generosity of our congregation which helped close the income/expense gap. Here is a summary of our income and expenses for the past five years. I think it shows that we continue to meet the financial challenges of increased costs and highlights the importance of your gifts.

Again, 2025 will present a challenge. Sodexo had been renting space for several years but ended the contract at the end of 2024. Cell tower revenues have fallen with companies cutting rental fees. The Board of Trustees and the Finance Committee will continue to work together to find potential tenants to replace those revenues, as well as to find ways to save. We will continue to explore saving money on landscaping or investing in solar panels for the roof to save on future electric bills.

Giving will continue to be a significant source of income. Our most recent pledge drive produced 57 members who pledged a total of \$271,260 for 2025. This compares with 52 pledges for a total of \$234,680 last year. So we are grateful. Thank you all for your generosity. My thanks to David Fraser for his leadership of the finance committee in these past few years. He accomplished a great deal.


