In God We Live, Move, and Exist

²²Paul stood up in the middle of the council on Mars Hill and said, "People of Athens, I see that you are very religious in every way. ²³As I was walking through town and carefully observing your objects of worship, I even found an altar with this inscription: 'To an unknown God.' What you worship as unknown, I now proclaim to you. ²⁴God, who made the world and everything in it, is Lord of heaven and earth. He doesn't live in temples made with human hands. ²⁵Nor is God served by human hands, as though he needed something, since he is the one who gives life, breath, and everything else. ²⁶From one person God created every human nation to live on the whole earth, having determined their appointed times and the boundaries of their lands. ²⁷God made the nations so they would seek him, perhaps even reach out to him and find him.
