## Building the Beloved Community

It is the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Declaration of Independence, which tells us that "all men are created equal." We haven't lived up to that promise yet, but I still think that with God's help, we will get there. As Martin Luther King, Jr. said, "we as a people will get to the promised land."



Just like in the Civil Rights era, we are at another inflection point. We stand in need of grace and justice that flows down like a mighty river.

On Monday, Jan. 19, I celebrated MLK with a chorus of women in white, singing for the marchers in Riverside. On Friday, Jan. 23, I was back on the street in downtown Riverside and I had a bullhorn in my hand leading the chanting in response to the death of Renee Good in Minneapolis. We did not know that there would be another death in Minneapolis the next day, Alex Pretti. Both Renee and Alex were 37, and from the reporting I've read, the federal agents celebrated their deaths.

This is the opposite of good police work.

I have been careful to keep my church life and my protest life separate, because I want my church to be the kind of big tent United Methodist congregation that welcomes everyone. There is no political litmus test.

But I do know that we are being tested about how well we follow Jesus.

Sometimes my protest signs are based on faith, for example "Jesus said welcome the stranger." I'm also following some of our clergy members in the act of street protest, like our Bishop Dottie Escobedo-Frank.

In a statement earlier this year, she wrote: "Tonight, I am calling on all Christ-following people, and on all tenderhearted people, to stand with those who are being ripped apart from their families. Speak to your politicians. March in peaceful protest. While you are there, make sure everyone is safe and responds in peace. Be witnesses on the streets so that the horror does not happen under cover. Pray for those whose cries you hear. Pray for the ICE agents to lay down their weapons. Pray for the leaders of our world, asking that they would seek peace above all. Pray for justice to prevail, because we all know that without justice, there is no peace. Attend prayer vigils. Hold one in your church or your neighborhood. Act, pray, and rise up where you see injustice and harm." (cont. on next page)

## Beloved Community (cont.)

If that call from our Bishop feels uncomfortable, just know that there are many roles in a movement. Make a meal and take it to someone who is hungry. Join an organization that supports immigrants or those who are hungry or in prison. Write letters to the editor or postcards that express your opinion to those who have the power to change things. Donate to a cause that you admire (and of course that can include your church.) Teach a Sunday School class. Even reading about our colonial history as a nation can be a good start.

Together, we can help create a world that is more loving. Bishop Tracy S. Malone, who leads our Council of Bishops, wrote a letter recently that states our mission as United Methodists. This statement was approved in our social principles by delegates to the Annual Conference.

"We reject governmental use of threats, extortion, unlawful detentions, extrajudicial killings, and other forms of coercion to silence political opponents and those objecting to unlawful or immoral government policies and practices." The church, Bishop Malone explains, has both the right and the responsibility to educate and equip its members to be advocates for justice in the wider world.

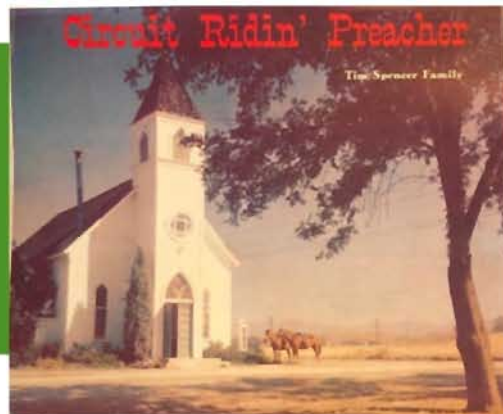

## A Fire That Leaves a Scar on History

Carolyn Greywood, a relatively new member, will be the speaker at our United Methodist Men luncheon on Feb. 8 at 11:15 am after morning worship.

The community of Murrieta was a small rural town in 1963. A quaint Methodist Church had served as the location for countless services, baptisms, weddings, and funerals extending back to 1886. In the early morning hours on April 10, 1963, a local fire alarm went off; the church was on fire. Like the original First Methodist Church building in downtown Riverside, the Murrieta Methodist Church building burned to the ground.

Carolyn Greywood and her family were members of that church. They watched helplessly as it burned. Her brother captured the moment in photos that she will share during her talk.

The cost of the lunch is \$6 per person or \$15 per family. We hope that you can join us for this time of fellowship.
